# I. What If This Is The Year Of New Beginnings? – Joshua 1:8-9

- a. Two Great Beginnings For The Early Church
  - i. Acts 2 Pentecost
  - ii. Acts 4 Again with thousands more that God adds to the church
- **b.** New Beginnings For You...
  - The year you receive Jesus Christ as your Lord & Savior (Acts 16:31) John 3:36;
    6:40
  - ii. The year you confess your sins and recommit your life (1 John 1:9) Hebrews 3:12-15
  - iii. The year your return to your first love (Revelation 2:4-5)
  - iv. The year you stop looking back and look up to Jesus (Hebrews 12:2-3)

### II. What If This Is The Year Your Prayers Are Answered? –Acts 4:31

- a. "When they prayed...the place was shaken"
  - **i.** Philippians 4:6-7; 1 Peter 3:10-12
- **b.** What prayers could be answered this year...
  - i. The year your children get right with God
  - ii. The year your spouse comes to Christ
  - iii. The year you conquer your negative attitude

#### III. What If This Is The Year Of Revival In Our Congregation? – Acts 4:31-32

- a. "They were all filled with the Holy Ghost"
  - i. Romans 8:11-14 are you being led by the Spirit of God?
  - ii. Titus 3:4-8 have you been regenerated and renewed?
  - iii. Galatians 5:22-25 Do you live and walk by the Spirit?
- **b.** What could revival do this year...
  - i. Revival could make this a year of forgiveness, sharing, reconciliation

# IV. <u>What If This Is The Year Of Evangelism? – Acts 4:33</u>

- a. "With great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus"
  - i. How long since you made an effort to win a soul?
