The "Attributes" Of God – 1 Timothy 1:17

Introduction

1. What a privilege it is to seek the face of God. The awesomeness, purity, glory of God. Seeking God to know Him is man's ultimate purpose...

I. <u>Incommunicable Attributes</u>

- **a.** God Is Immutable
 - i. There are certain attributes that make God, "God." These can never belong to man.
 - ii. God never changes! (Malachi 3:6; Numbers 23:19; Isaiah 40:28; James 1:17; Hebrews 6:17; 13:8) God *is* what He can be. He is His potential! God cannot deny Himself (2 Timothy 2:13). He cannot be less than God.
- **b.** God Is Infinite
 - i. God cannot be wrong, change, learn, forget, or lie. God is limitlessness (John 4:23-24; Matthew 19:26).
- **c.** God Is Omniscient (All Knowing)
 - i. God knows the past, the present, the future. No one can teach God (Romans 11:33-36).
- **d.** God Is Omnipresent (Everywhere)
 - i. Just read Psalm 139.
- e. God Is Eternal
 - i. God is timeless. The past, present, and future are all the same with God.
- **f.** God Is Life
 - i. God has life in Himself (John 5:26). He is the beginning and the end (Revelation 1:8). Nothing exists without God.

II. Communicable Attributes

- **a.** Holiness
 - i. Another exalted privilege we have is that we can "be like God." We are to be holy as God is holy (1 Peter 1:14-16). This is a command and one we should not take lightly (Hebrews 12:10,14).
- **b.** Faithfulness
 - i. God is faithful to us especially in His presence, purpose, and promises. We too can make and keep promises. We can be like God in our commitment.
- **c.** Goodness
 - i. God is good, and man can be too (Romans 11:22).
- **d.** Unity
 - i. The trinity is one! Jesus prayed for our unity with God (John 17:20-22). God's church must be one-united.
- e. Justice
 - i. God will always do right (Genesis 18:25; Romans 12:19; Hebrews 10:30-31). We have been called to treat people right like Jesus did.
- **f.** Love, Mercy, Grace
 - i. God is love (1 John 4:8,16). God is grace (Matthew 22:35-40). We prove to be disciples with love (John 13:34-35). We receive grace in order to practice grace.
