"What do you think, Simon?" he asked. "From whom do the kings of the earth collect duty and taxes-- from their own sons or from others?" "From others," Peter answered. "Then the sons are exempt." (Matthew 17:25-26)

• Exodus 30:13 commands all Jewish males to pay God an annual ransom for his life. The ransom amount was half a shekel (Greek = didrachma).
