In our text spiritual growth is not an end in itself; it is ato an end. The end is fruitfulness: "For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they render you neither useless nor unfruitful in the true knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."
V. Remember Our Cleansing
In the next verse Peter said, "For he who lacks these qualities is blind or short-sighted, having forgotten his purification from his former sins." (1:9). If we appreciate what a thing God did for us when He saved us, we will surely not be inclined to go back into the world.
VI. Be Zealous
Twice in this passage zeal is required. Verse 5 says, "Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence [or do your best, be zealous] in your faith supply virtue." Verse 10 says, "be all the more diligent to make certain about His calling and choosing you;"
